Breast Cancer is on the rise. At least 300 women die as a direct result of breast cancer in the UK each week. That's the equivalent to a plane full of women crashing every week of the year. And another two plane-loads of women each week hear they have the disease.

Within the EU every 2.5 minutes a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer. Every 7.5 minutes a woman dies from the disease. We want to know why!

A growing mountain of research points the finger

at chemicals in the environment and in the products we use on a daily basis. Over 300 of these chemicals are now found in our bodies. Everyday products like cosmetics, toiletries, plastics, household cleaners and furnishings contain chemicals thought to contribute to breast cancer.

Yet we are using them blindfolded. Many of these chemicals have never been adequately safety tested and companies don't have to tell consumers what is in most products we buy. There are things you can do about this. Join our campaigns and take action this October for Breast Cancer Month.

- On October 3rd join us in sending a strong visual message to government and EU legislators. Get together with your colleagues and replay the BIG SEE image with your pink blindfolds for the press and media. Show your eyes have been opened and you are not blind to the evidence that chemicals are linked to the rise in breast cancer.
- Lobby your MEP to vote for a strong REACH, the new draft European legislation to regulate the use of chemicals, which aims to protect health and the environment.
- The first reading of REACH is due in November 2005 but proposals have already been weakened and are still under attack. MEPs need to know NOW that the public wants them to take action to reduce their exposure to toxic chemicals. Please write to your MEPs and tell them this. Find them at www.writetothem.com
