



Prime Minister Reinfeldt where will you take us?

On the road to the world's climate change conference in Copenhagen this December, the European Union has lost its way. The Swedish Presidency of the EU starting next week must get Europe back on track. Fast.

With time running out for the world to control climate change and international climate talks heading into a dead-end, the EU has spent the first half of the year going in circles.

When the Swedish Presidency begins on 1st July there will be only 171 days left to strike a global deal in Copenhagen, and no time to waste. The Swedish Presidency must design and champion an EU Roadmap to Copenhagen that allows the EU to break the deadlock, first in its own internal position, and then in international talks.

Waiting for the US or China to move first has only proved to be a strategy for stalemate. Now the EU must show it can break the impasse. That will take bold leadership from your Presidency, not neutral facilitation.

Prime Minister Reinfeldt, Sweden has been preparing this Presidency for years. 171 days will decide how it is remembered for generations.
