Gender & Rights

WECF active at global Rio+20 meetings and side events in France, the Netherlands Switzerland and the United States

WECF actively participated in international Rio+20 meetings and side events in France, the Netherlands, Switzerland and the United States. WECF director Sascha Gabizon represented the Women's major group global position for Rio+20, focusing on women's rights and on thematic priorities such as addressing "land grabbing" and "nuclear risks" at the meeting on gender and women priorities for Rio+20 at the Foreign Ministry, 7 November in Paris.

On November 11, Sustainability Day in the Netherlands, WECF was co-organiser along with the Dutch Platform Rio+20, the Dutch Gender Platform WO=MEN and Womeninc of the meeting **"Gender Priorities for Rio+20"**



On the 2nd of December WECF organised a side event at the UNECE Rio+20 conference **"From 'Brown' Economy** to 'Care' Economy: Women's priorities for Rio+20" in Geneva. On the 15th of December, WECF organized a side event on women's priorities for Rio+20 with a focus on **"equitable" economy** in New York.

Energy & Climate

Training on construction, use and maintenance of solar collectors in Chardakhi, Georgia

30 participants from eight villages in Georgia were trained in October in the construction use and manintance of solar collectors. WECF's activities were introduced, environmental issues and business opportunities were discussed as well as gender related topics. The training was given with the aim for each participant to have built two solar collectors before Christmas in seven villages in rural Georgia.

The training was organised in the frame of the project 'Building local capacity for domestic solar heating, hot water and insulation for rural and remote areas in the EEC region' with financial support of the European Commission.



Closing conference "Sharing Lessons Learned", 25 - 26 November 2011, Baku, Azerbaijan

WECF, together with the local partner EKOT, organized a closing conference on 25-26 of November 2011 in Baku, Azerbaijan to present the experiences of the 2 year project **"Community approaches to a better environment for all and poverty reduction in out of reach communities of Rural Azerbaijan**", which took place in six villages in Sabirabad, Saatli, Ismayilli and Shemakha regions in Azerbaijan.

Chemicals & Health

WECF France and WECF the Netherlands organized succesful Toys Events in November

On November 10 WECF the Netherlands organized **the first Dutch Toys Convention**, where a toys' test to assess the use of harmful chemicals in our children's toys was conducted. During an interactive afternoon with speakers from politics, science and the toy industry, parents and stakeholders discussed the present situation and formulated recommendations for national and European policy makers. The event was followed by a new WECF publication on Toys safety "Spelbrekers ".



A week later on November the 16th, WECF France, with the support of Quad-Lab laboratory, organized a toys testing action in Paris.Testing confirmed that toys sold on the European markets still contained chemicals of concern. **See the report on the French TV News TF1**

Water & Sanitation

Nexus Conference: WECF hosted hot topic session on food safety, water, sanitation, and hygiene

The conference "The Water Energy and Food Security Nexus – Solutions for the Green Economy" was organised by the German Ministry of Development Cooperation and the German Ministry of Environment and Nuclear Safety and provided the German input on the Rio +20 negotiations 2012. The linkage between water, energy and food was put in the centre of the discussion and led to policy recommendations related to the nexus.

WECF with the German WASH network was part of the Nexus conference hosting one hot topic session "No Food and Nutrition Security without Water, Sanitation and Hygiene". Sascha Gabizon, executive director of WECF welcomed the conference: "Facing today's global challenges, the nexus approach is very much needed, start thinking out of the sectors. The women's traditional role has always been to think in a holistic way to make the family's and community's life sustainable."

In 2010, despite the financial crisis, WECF has continued to increase its outreach to share the visions and priorities of women and their communities with decision makers and the general public around the world, particularly through our websites and facebookpages reaching several hundred thousand visitors.
