As this month' toxic-milk scare in Europe has shown, products on the market in the Western Balkans could contain hazardous substances. Governments have taken a number of measures, however, still many problems remain.

The conference “Chemical and product safety in the Western Balkans” taking place in Belgrade, Serbia on 11 of April, will address share lessons learned from a 2-year EU-funded project on the issue, will share preliminary results of the national consultations on possible priorities for a post-2015 development agenda, and formulate recommendations. Participants will be experts from national authorities, policy makers from the Western Balkans, EU and international level, science, social responsible entrepreneurs, trade unions and civil society from Serbia, FYR of Macedonia and Albania as well as a number of EU member states. The conference will provide exhibition space for interested companies and organisations, to present products, inventories, tool kits, training materials and publications.

The conference is organised by WECF International, UNDP Serbia and non-governmental partners from the Western Balkans, with support of the European Union and the Ministries of Environment and Health of Serbia.
