Half the proportion of people whose income is less than \$1 a day  
Achieve full and productive employment and decent work for all  
Halve the proportion of people who suffer from hunger



Ensure that children everywhere will be able to complete primary schooling



Eliminate gender disparity in all levels of education  
At least 1/3 Women in national parliaments

## MDG Targets

- Quantitative
- Time-bound
- Donor coordination ca. 100 billion per year



Reduce by two thirds the under-five mortality rate



Reduce by three quarters the maternal mortality ratio  
Achieve universal access to reproductive health

... But not human rights based



Have halted and begun to reverse the spread of HIV/AIDS  
Achieve universal access to treatment for HIV/AIDS for all those who need it  
Have halted and begun to reverse the incidence of malaria and other major diseases

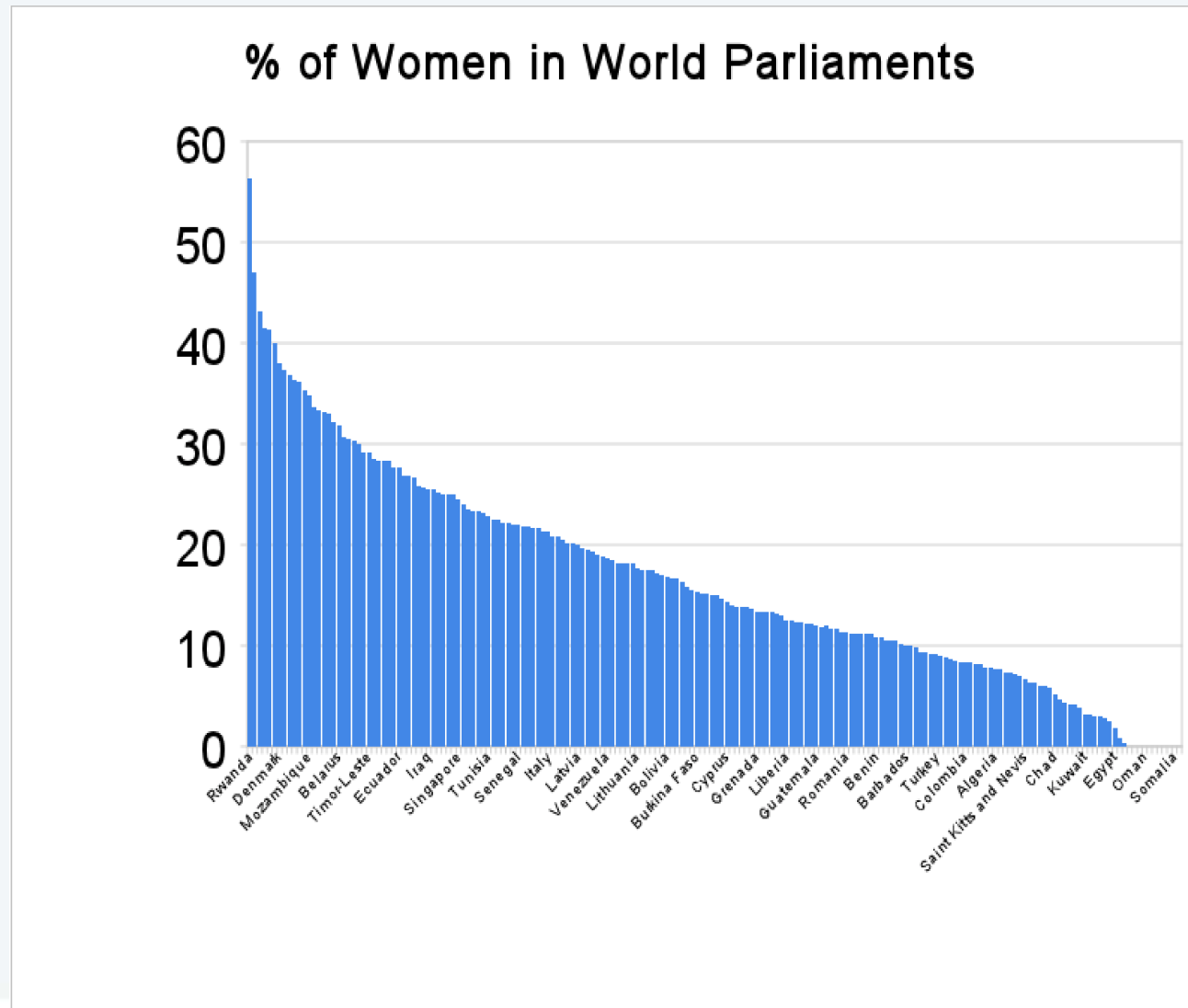


Integrate the principles of sustainable development into country policies  
Reduce biodiversity loss, achieving a significant reduction in the rate of loss  
Halve the proportion of the population without access to safe drinking water and sanitation  
Achieve a significant improvement in the lives of at least 100 million slum dwellers



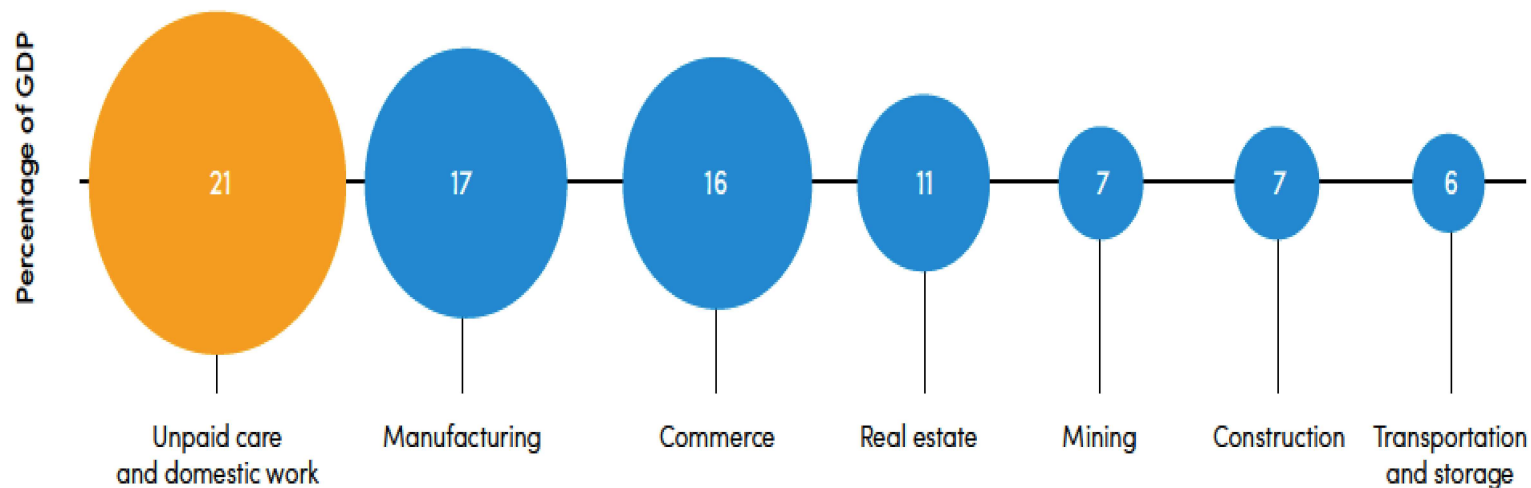
Address the special needs of least developed countries  
Develop further an open, non-discriminatory trading and financial system  
Deal comprehensively with developing countries' debt  
In cooperation with pharmaceutical companies, provide access to affordable essential drugs  
In cooperation with the private sector, make available benefits of new technologies

# New: recognition of care economy

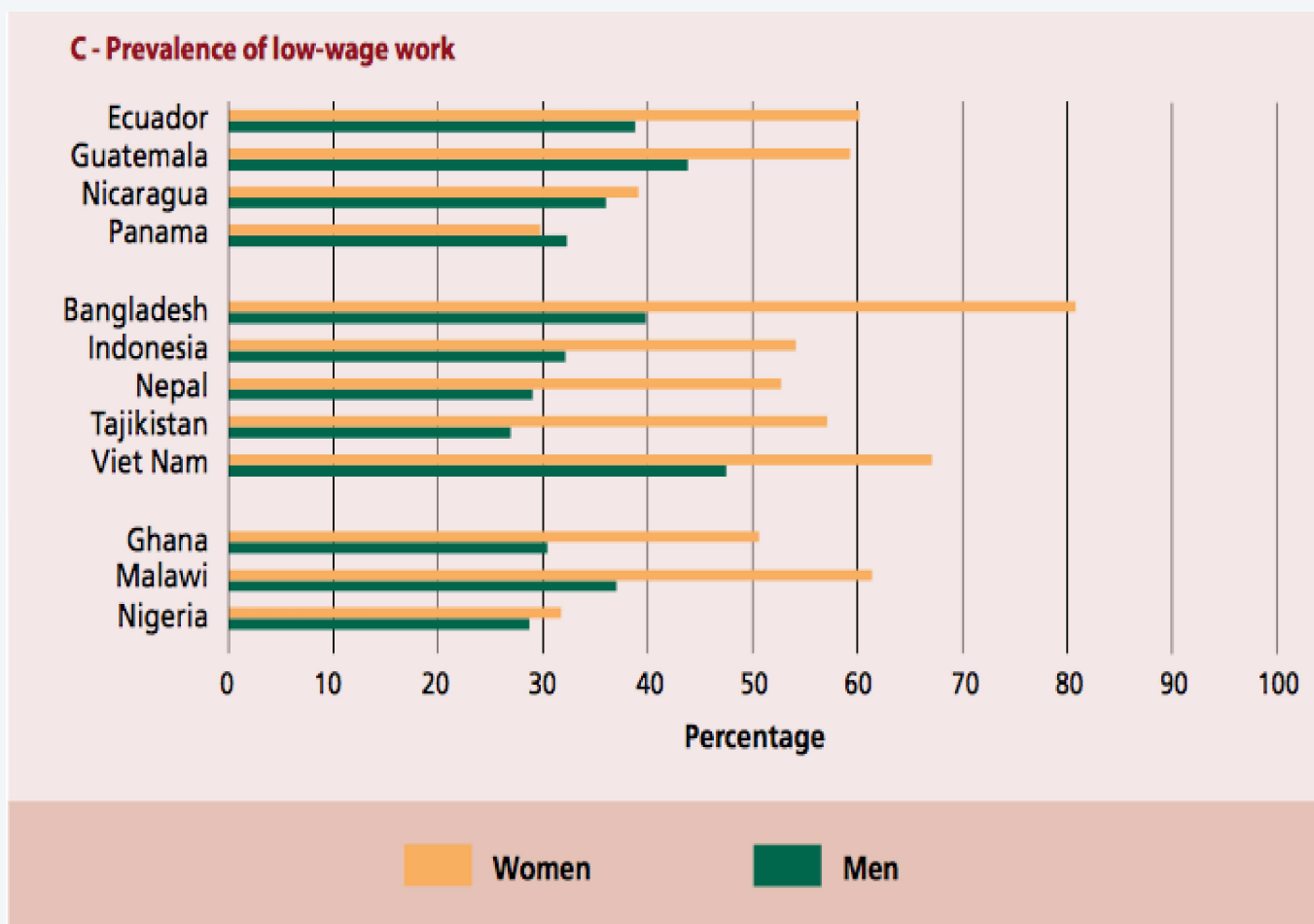
Economic value of unpaid care and domestic work and select areas of economic activity as a percentage of GDP, 2013  
→ In Mexico, the economic value of unpaid care and domestic work is greater than mining, construction, and transportation and storage combined

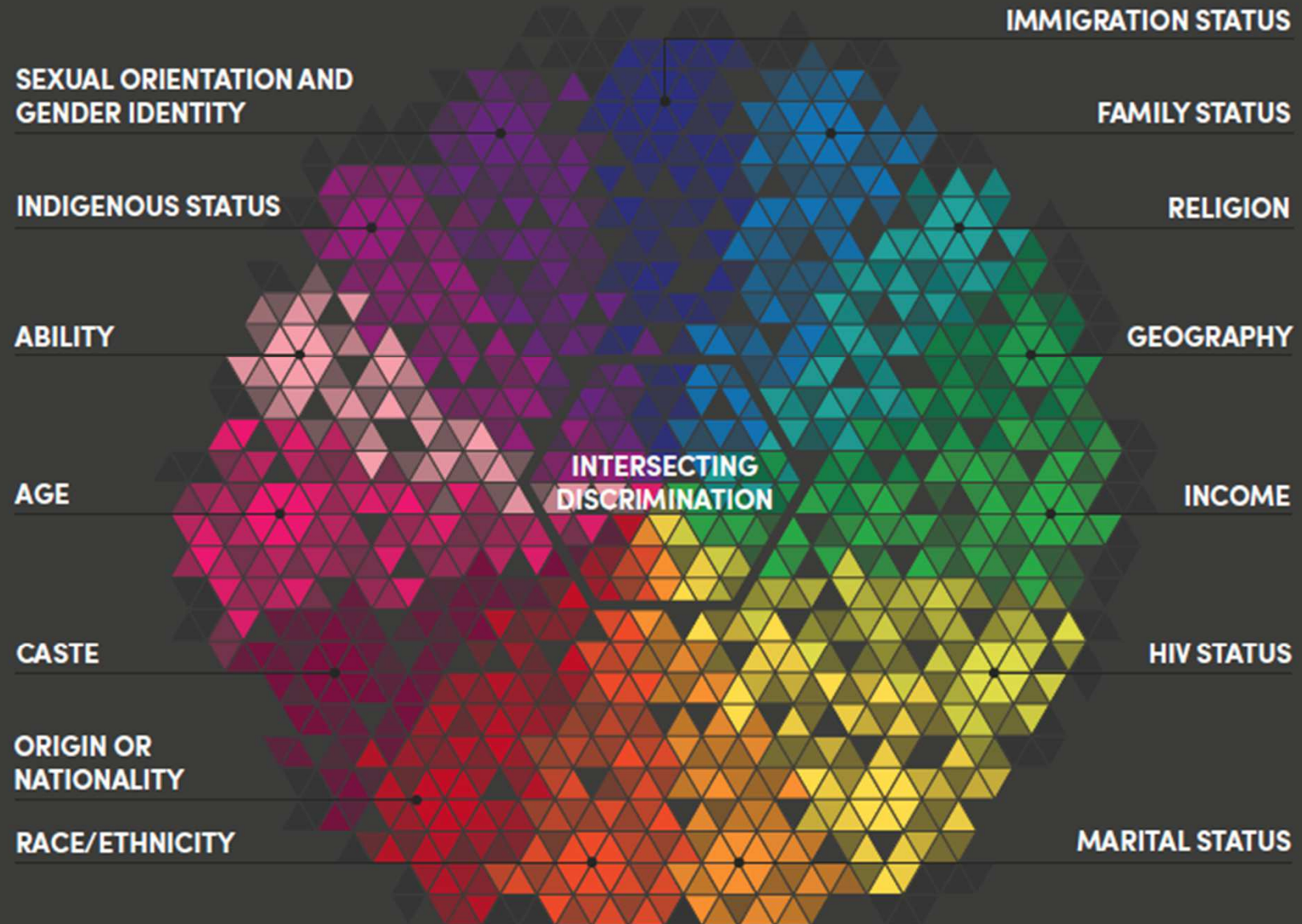

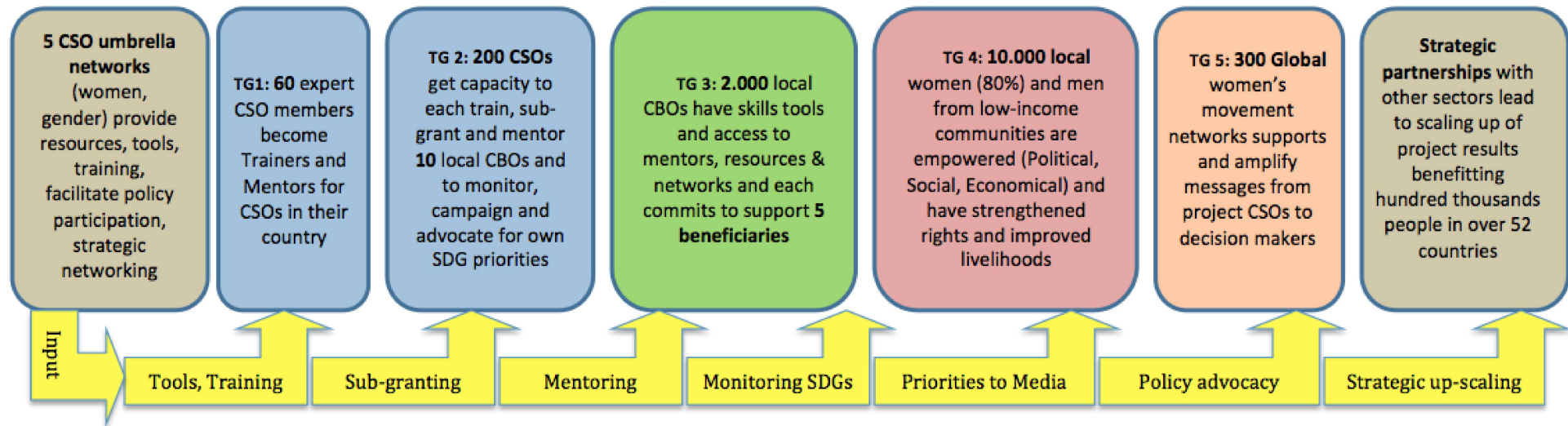

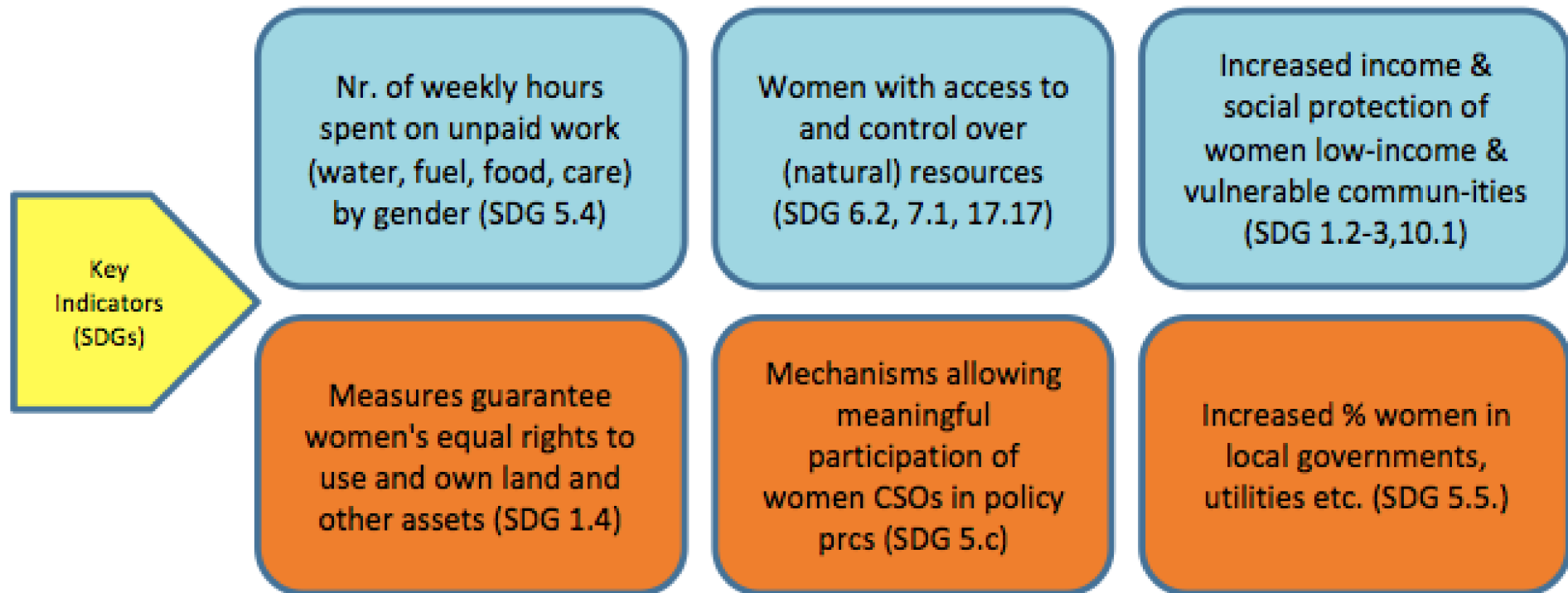

## Theory of Change – Methodology

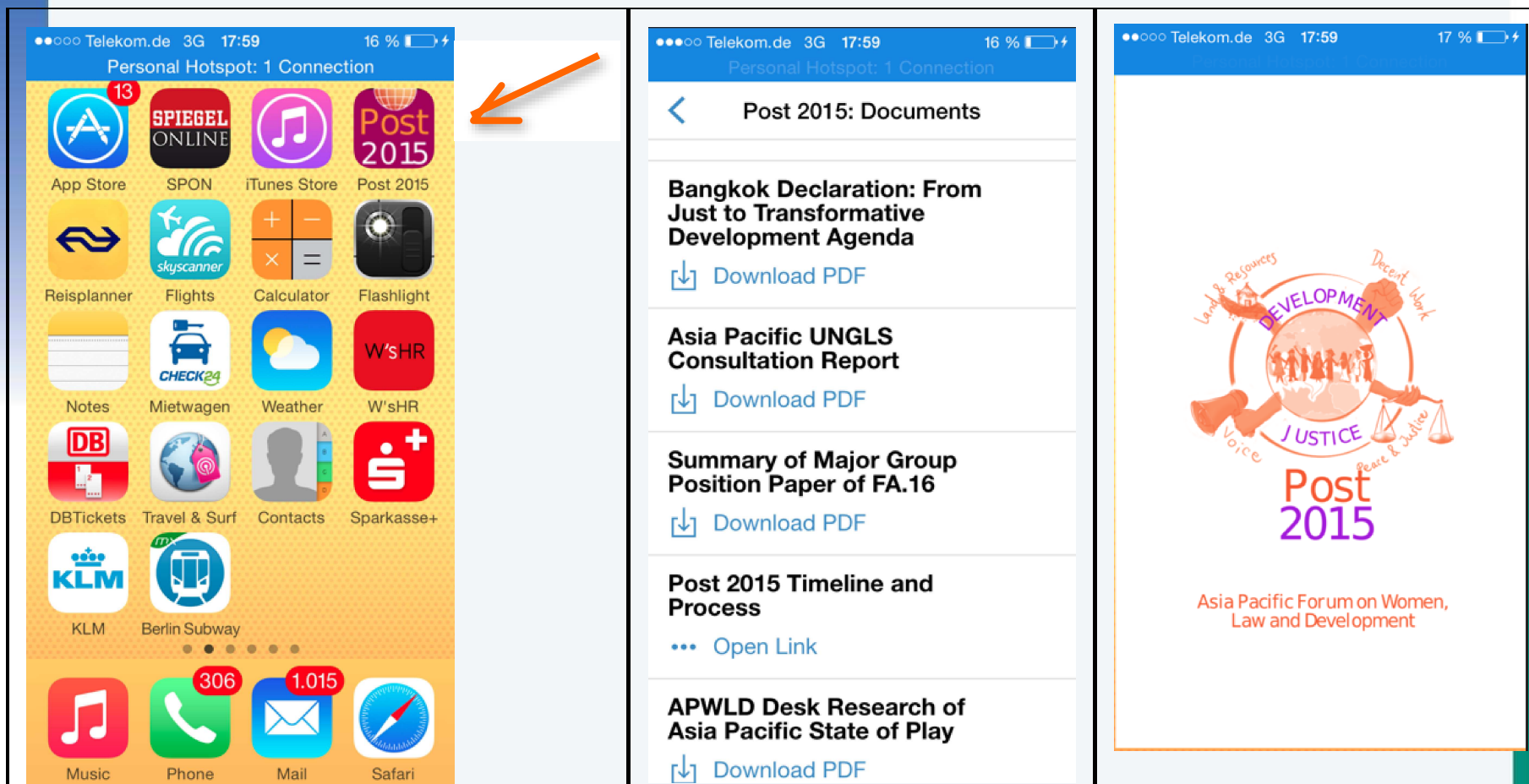

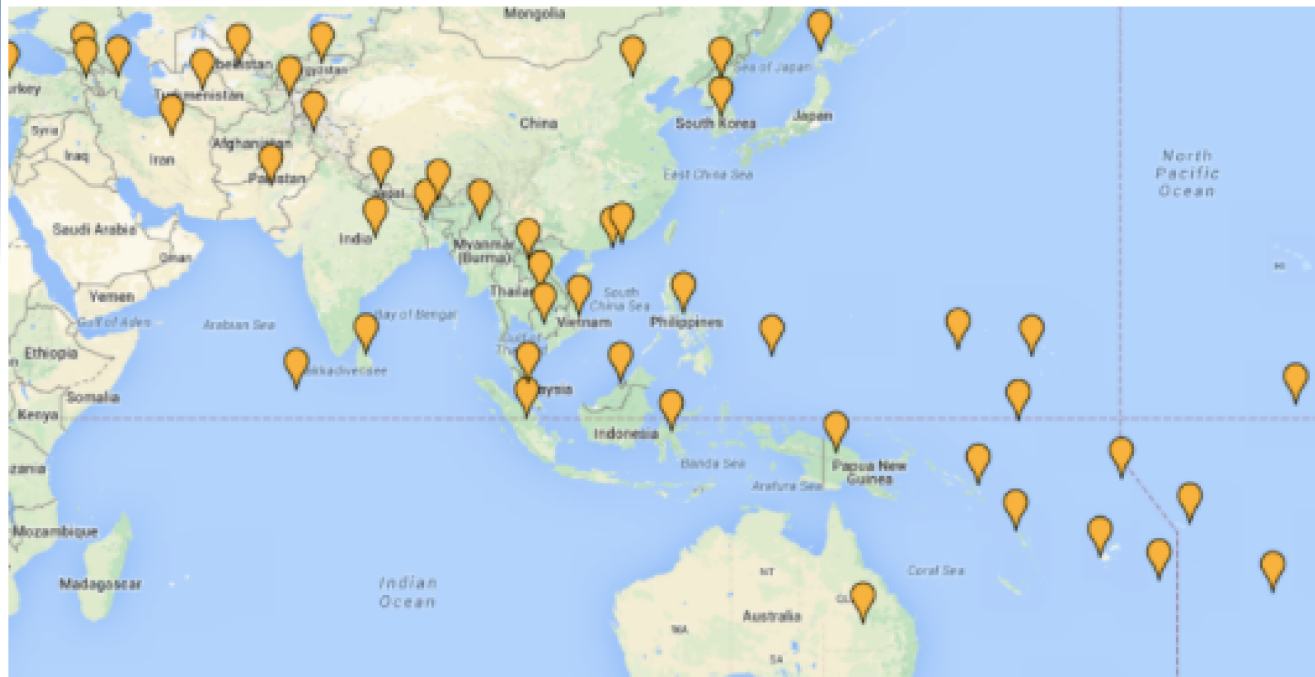

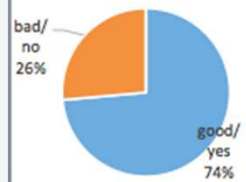

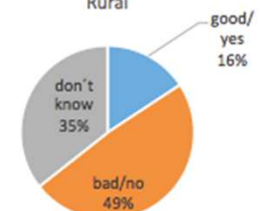




Employed WOMEN at work - Rural
